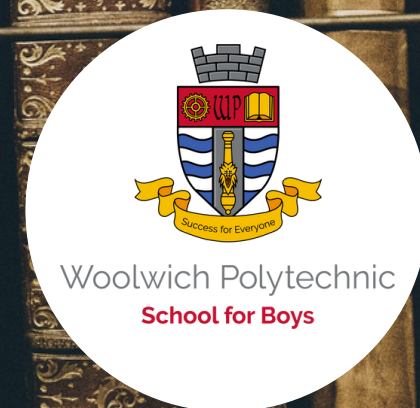

Autumn Term Year 12

Topic: Paper 1, Breadth, The Tudors 1C

Key Learning: Students will be introduced to Henry VII and the start of the Tudor Dynasty. Exploring key themes such as: consolidation of power, government, foreign policy, and social and economic changes.

Topic: Paper 2, Depth, USA, 2Q

Key Learning: Students will be introduced to the challenges faced by the USA at home and abroad as it emerged from the Second World War as a Superpower. Students will be introduced to USA President Truman exploring key themes including: WWII legacies, containment and reconstruction.

Spring Term Year 12

Topic: Paper 1, Breadth, The Tudors 1C

Key Learning: Students will continue to study the Tudor Dynasty and be introduced to Henry VIII. Exploring key themes such as: religion, government, foreign policy, and social and economic changes.

Topic: Paper 2, Depth, USA, 2Q

Key Learning: Students will continue to study post-war America and be introduced to Presidents Eisenhower and Kennedy, exploring key themes including: the growth of the American economy, superpower rivalries and the Civil Rights Movement.

Topic: Paper 2, Depth, USA, 2Q

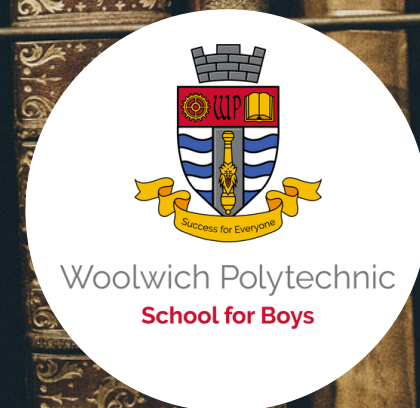
Key Learning: Student will finish the year by consolidating their learning of Truman, Eisenhower and Kennedy and prepare for end of year exams.
