Paper 2: Prose (Science and Society) 20% 1 hour 15 mins

Mary Shelley's Frankenstein and Margaret Atwood's The Handmaid's Tale.

Paper 3: Poetry 30 % 2 hrs 15 mins

Unseen poetry and a contemporary anthology - Poems of the Decade
